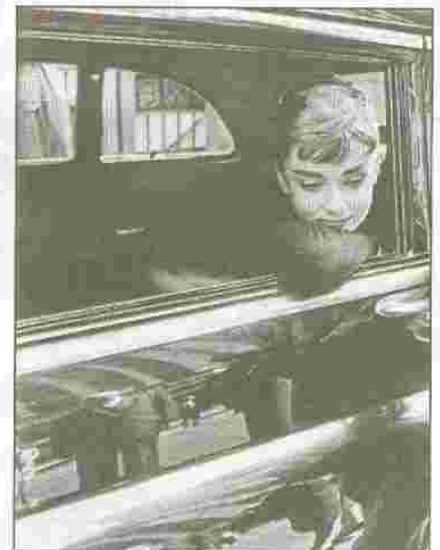

**A** hundred years ago, D. W. Griffith made the first-ever Hollywood movie. It was called *In Old California*. The 17-minute silent movie, an adventure set in Spanish colonial days, was an overnight success. Griffith discovered Hollywood on his trips to sunny California and loved the stunning scenery and friendly people. But little did he know what he was starting! By the late 1910s, Hollywood became synonymous with cinema and its burgeoning glamour.
